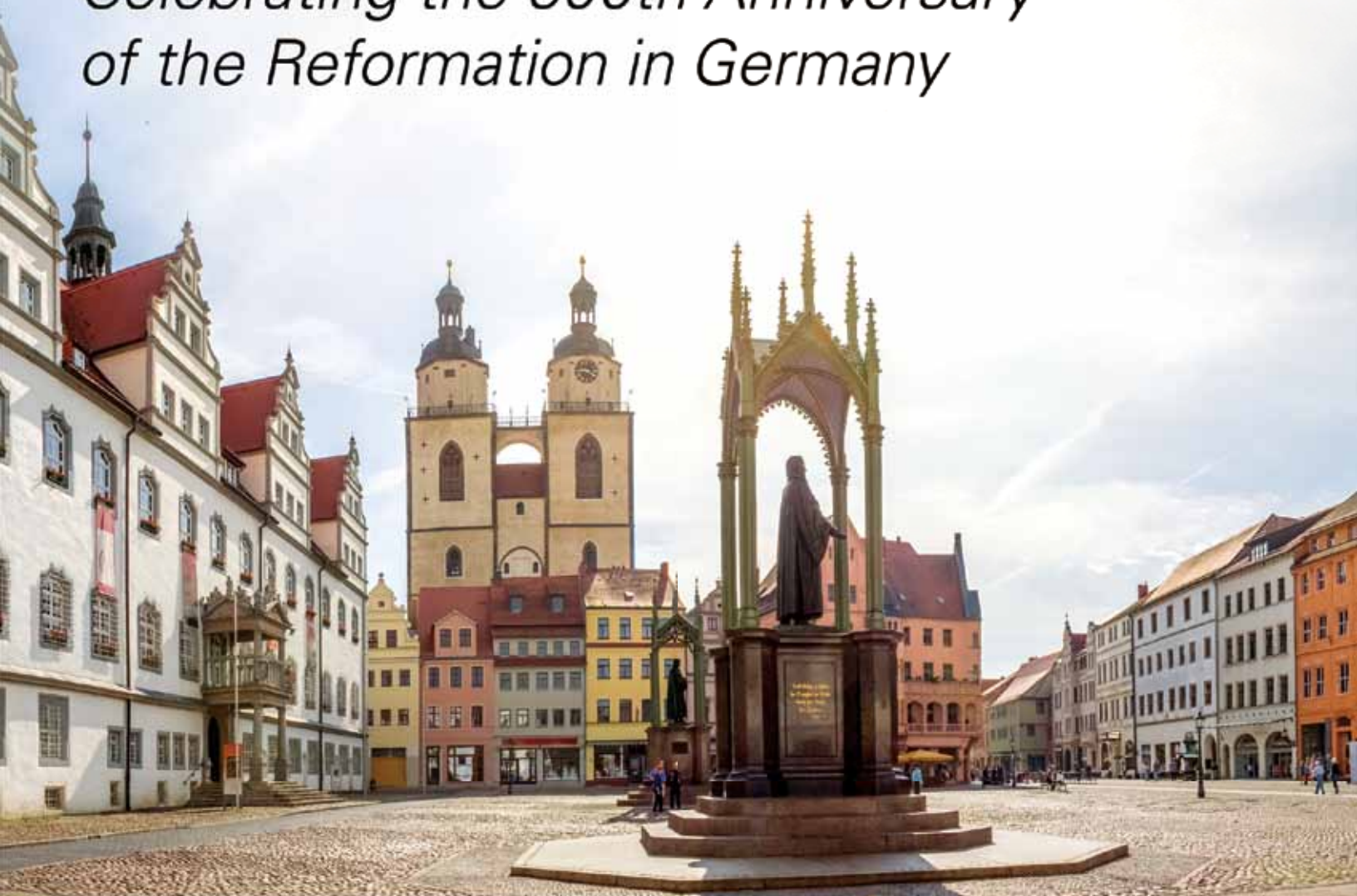

Thursday, October 19

Departure

The day of departure has arrived. We will meet at the Newark Liberty International Airport to check in for our non-stop flight to Europe. Our adventure is beginning! (D-in flight)

Friday, October 20

Frankfurt, Mainz

Guten Tag, and welcome to Germany! We touch down in Frankfurt this morning, meet our tour manager, and board the waiting motorcoach. The first drive of our tour takes us to the city center of Frankfurt am Main to set ourselves amid the imperial coronations of the Holy Roman Empire at the Imperial Cathedral of St. Bartholomew, with a visit to the Dommuseum, following prayers in the Electoral Chapel. We will also visit the Städel Museum—one of the world's most distinguished collections—and enjoy an independent lunch at the Holbein Café-Restaurant. After a leisurely period of reflection, we travel to Mainz to visit the Gutenberg Museum, home of two editions of the world-famous Gutenberg Bible, which spread the Word of God far and wide across the globe. After checking in at the hotel for a two-night stay, we relax over a welcome dinner. (B-in Flight, D)



Saturday, October 21
Worms, Mainz

After a good night's sleep and breakfast, we're ready to do some exploring! We start with an excursion to nearby Worms to see the 19-century Luther Memorial, the largest Reformation monument in the world. Upon return to Mainz, we'll tour the romantic Kaiserdom of St. Martin—the ecclesiastical center north of the Alps with the efforts of St. Boniface from 746 AD. Then walk through the historic avenues symbolizing the powerful Kurfürsten, the prince-electors who crowned German kings in Aachen and Frankfurt. For over 500 years, this city has played a great role in the spread of the Reformation. In a spirit of reconciliation and hope, we hold our *Commissioning Holy Communion* and receive a tour in St. Stephen's Church, which is renowned for its post-war ministries, Chagall glass windows, and Gothic Cloister. The rest of the afternoon will be free to wander and choose from one of Mainz's many restaurants for an independent dinner. (B)

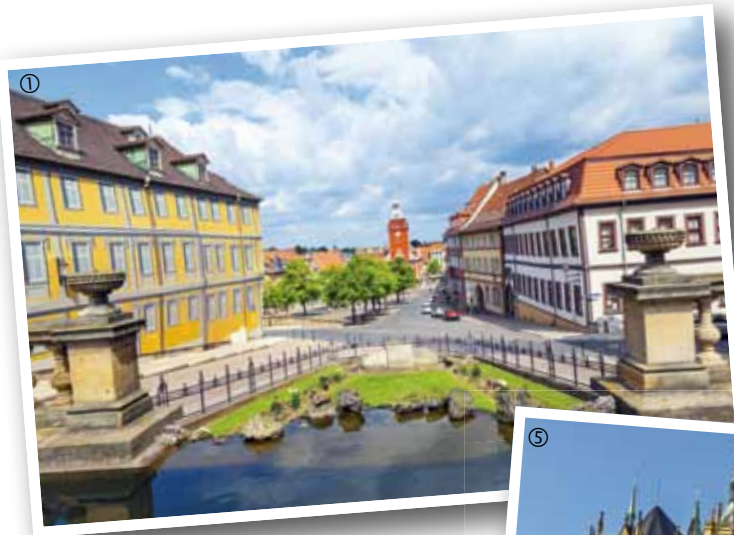
Sunday, October 22
Frankfurt, Fulda, Eisenach

This Sunday morning, we join the Anglican/Episcopal community of Christ the King in Frankfurt. We then travel to Fulda to view the eighth-century reincarnation of the Holy Sepulcher at Michaelskirche. Crossing the basilica gardens to the Cathedral of Christ Our Savior, we offer prayers in the crypt-chapel of St. Boniface, "Apostle to the Germans," one of the premier religious sites in Germany. We travel onward to Eisenach, on the northwestern edge of the Thuringian Forest. Enjoy a traditional "Luther dinner" to sample authentic dishes from Luther's time, using only knives and spoons to remain true to the age-old custom. (B, D)

Monday, October 23
Eisenach

As birds soar to greet the autumn day, we visit Wartburg Castle, perched on a rocky spur above town. It was here that Luther retreated from the hounds of the Empire and worked on his translation of the New Testament from the original Greek text to German. Here, we find a special anniversary exhibition, "*Luther and the Germans*." We then tour the Knight's Hall, the dining room, the Wartburg Museum, and Luther's room. In town, we hear the story of the Bach House, celebrated for manuscripts, scores, and portraits recalling not only Johann Sebastian Bach, but also several other members of his family—all of them composers. We discover St. George Church, where Bach was baptized and Luther preached on May 2, 1521, even though officially banned from the Holy Roman Empire, and we will renew our own Baptismal Covenant. Tuesday, October 24
Gotha, Erfurt

The holy of holies among European royal families, interconnected down the centuries, Gotha looms in our path to assist in our comprehension of the ruling dynasties of Thüringia (“middle Germany”). Riding on a hill over the city, Schloss Friedenstien bids us welcome to experience its gardens, art, and historic collections, and the ducal rooms of what was once one of the largest and most palatial homes in the world—from 1643 to 1918. After an enlightening morning to reflect, our time moves us toward Erfurt, known as the “Town of Flowers.” We view the Augustinian Monastery, where Luther once lived and worked. Then it’s onward to the massive Erfurt Cathedral and the Merchants’ Bridge, a unique bridge lined with quaint shops, for a lovely afternoon and evening on our own. (B)

Wednesday, October 25
Eisleben, Torgau, Wittenberg

What a joy to discover Eisleben, the small mining town where Luther was born and where he died! We visit the site of Luther’s birth house, where a museum contains information about his origins, childhood, and youth. We also experience the Church of St. Andrew, where Luther delivered the last sermons of his life and his funeral service was held. Moving across the land toward Torgau, we grasp the beauty of this region. A guided tour awaits us at Schloss Hartenfels, the administrative and social center of the Saxon electors, remembered for their political and theological support of the Reformation. Of significance, the Castle Chapel was the first purpose-built Protestant house of worship. As the sun sets, we arrive in Lutherstadt-Wittenberg. Dinner will be enjoyed as a group tonight. (B, D)

Thursday, October 26
Wittenberg

Today we explore Wittenberg, the “cradle” of the Reformation. Our guided tour includes a visit to the *Lutherhalle* (Luther House), formerly a monastery and later Luther’s home, where some of the original rooms are on display and a special exhibit called, “*Luther! 95 Treasures – 95 People*” is housed. We proceed in homage to St. Mary’s City Church and the Castle Church. It was to the door of the Castle Church that Luther affixed his 95 Theses on All Hallows Eve, October 31, 1517. This massive late-Gothic structure contains the graves of Luther and Philipp Melancthon, a close friend of Luther and fellow Reformer. This afternoon, we plan to attend an English-language worship service at the Castle Church at 3:00 p.m., followed by some free time and a group dinner. (B, D)



Friday, October 27
Wittenberg

Our sightseeing of Wittenberg continues with a visit to the house of Philipp Melanchthon to learn about his life, work, and legacy. Built in 1536 in the Renaissance style, it is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Then we visit the Cranach Courtyard and Workshop. Lucas Cranach the Elder is known as the “Reformation Painter,” since his portraits of Martin Luther and his wife, Katharina von Bora, helped spread the Reformation. The Protestant faith was also a central theme of his son, Lucas Cranach the Younger’s work. Our day includes a special exhibit, “*Luther 1517, a 360-degree Panorama*,” which is devoted to the events that took place in Wittenberg 500 years ago. The rest of the afternoon and evening are free to explore Wittenberg and have an independent dinner. (B)

Saturday, October 28
Berlin

On our final day of exploration, we travel to Berlin, Germany’s dynamic and cosmopolitan capital city. We will be moved by the extraordinary witness of the Dietrich Bonhoeffer House—a memorial to the life and work of the young Lutheran pastor-theologian, who staunchly opposed the Nazi regime. An orientation tour follows to introduce us to the highlights and includes views of the Reichstag, the Brandenburg Gate, and the *Kurfürstendamm*—an area filled with cafes, restaurants, theaters, and fashionable shops. We conclude our journey offering prayers for perpetual peace in Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church. The rest of the day is free to explore Berlin on our own and finish our souvenir shopping. We will reconvene this evening for a festive farewell dinner. (B, D)

Sunday, October 29
Return Home

Early this morning, we transfer to the Berlin Tegel airport to check in for our flights back to Newark, following what has surely been an educational and inspiring pilgrimage! (B, Lin flight)

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The cost of your tour includes:

Air transportation from Newark to Frankfurt and from Berlin back to Newark with any regularly scheduled air carrier, based on a nonrefundable/nonchangeable fare, which requires a minimum of 10 passengers traveling round trip together. The identity of the carrier, which may include the carrier's code-share partner, will be assigned and disclosed in your final documents. Tickets are issued 45 days prior to departure. All current airlines taxes, security fees and fuel surcharges are included. Note that these items cannot be guaranteed until tickets are issued.

Secure flight information. The requirement to collect date of birth, gender, and full name are federally mandated by the Transportation Security Administration's (TSA) Secure Flight Program. While disclosure of this information is voluntary, if it is not provided, participants may be denied boarding. For TSA's policy and more information, visit <http://www.tsa.gov> and search on Secure Flight. Witte Travel & Tours (Witte) takes all reasonable steps to safeguard the privacy of all information collected from its clients.

Frequent flyer points are not guaranteed in connection with group airfares. Some airlines may limit group airfare credits to 25% to 50% of the frequent flyer points that apply to individuals while others do not offer any credits for group airfares.

Hazardous Materials. Federal law forbids the carriage of hazardous materials aboard aircraft in your luggage or on your person. A violation can result in five years' imprisonment and penalties of \$250,000 or more (49 U.S.C. 5124). Hazardous materials include explosives, compressed gases, flammable liquids and solids, oxidizers, poisons, corrosives and radioactive materials. Land transportation. A deluxe air-conditioned motorcoach is used for transfers, excursions, and travel between cities. Because motorcoach travel is restricted in many European cities, sightseeing is often done on foot or via public transportation.

Accommodations based on two persons sharing a room with private facilities. Most hotels we use range from moderate first-class to standard first-class. When hotels in these categories are not available, top-quality superior tourist-class properties are selected. **The supplement for single accommodations is \$400.** If you register alone but want a roommate, we will do our best to assign one. If a single room must be assigned to any member of the group for any reason, even if it is at the last minute or while on tour, we will need to charge the single supplement. Changes in rooming arrangements requested by the participant 45 or fewer days prior to departure may result in additional charges.

Meals. Breakfast daily, lunches and dinners as indicated in the itinerary. Dinners do not include beverages.

A multi-lingual tour manager to accompany the group from arrival in Frankfurt until departure from Berlin. The tour manager may be assisted by local guides as needed.

Sightseeing and admission fees in accordance with the itinerary.

Tip and taxes are included for all services, including the tip for the tour manager and motorcoach driver.

The tour cost does not include passports, airline luggage fees if charged, portage of luggage, optional travel protection plan including luggage and trip cancellation coverage, optional excursions, independent meals, and any other items not mentioned as included.

Luggage allowance. You may take one suitcase with a maximum size of 62 linear inches (height plus width plus depth) and weight of 50 lbs. You may also carry a purse, a camera and one piece of hand luggage with a maximum size of 45 linear inches and weight of 15 lbs. These size and weight restrictions conform to most airlines' requirements. Hand luggage does not fit in the overhead bins on the motorcoach. There may be room for it in the storage compartment under

the coach or by an empty seat on board. If not, it will need to be placed on the floor in front of your feet. Portage of luggage is not provided. Participants will be responsible for carrying their own luggage throughout the tour. If you are physically unable to carry your luggage, ask your tour personnel to arrange for assistance.

Insecticide Disclosure. Some countries require that aircraft be treated with insecticides prior to flight or while occupied. For a list of the countries with insecticide requirements, go to <http://airconsumer.dot.gov/spray.htm>.

Optional travel protection. Witte recommends that you purchase a travel protection plan. For your convenience, Witte Travel offers a travel protection plan designed by Travelex Insurance Services. This travel protection can be purchased at any time prior to making the final payment for your tour. The pre-existing medical conditions exclusion will be waived if you purchase the protection plan within 14 days of the initial trip deposit, provided you are medically fit to travel at the time of purchase. Tours over 30 days are not eligible for coverage. The plan cost for the travel protection plan that applies to your tour will be noted in your brochure and on the registration form. It may be necessary to increase the trip cost insured on the travel protection plan if you purchase additional services and/or upgrade any arrangements. This could increase the plan cost of the travel protection plan. The plan cost for this travel protection plan is non-refundable after a 10 day review period.

Prior to purchasing, you may request a copy of the Description of Coverage, which includes a summary of the plan details on benefits, coverages, limitations and exclusions of the protection plan. The Description of Coverage will be included in the confirmation packet of those travelers who purchase this travel protection. *Travel Assistance & Concierge Services are provided by the designated provider listed in the Description of Coverage. Maximum trip length allowed is 30 days. Rates are subject to change. Travel Insurance is underwritten by Transamerica Casualty Insurance Company, Columbus, Ohio; NAIC#109521355603.

Documentation: U.S. citizens are required to have a valid passport. If you already have a passport, check its expiration date now since the country visited on this tour requires passports to be valid for at least six months beyond the traveler's intended return date. If your passport is due to expire earlier, you will need to obtain a new one. If you do not have a passport or need a new one, apply as soon as possible. If you plan to visit other countries on your own, contact Witte for any special requirements. All non-U.S. citizens should contact Witte for their special requirements. We will check the requirements for non-U.S. citizens at the time they register and again approximately 45 days prior to departure. Witte is not responsible for any changes in requirements for non-U.S. citizens that occur after our final check.

Minor children traveling internationally without both parents are encouraged to carry a notarized note signed by both parents stating that they have permission to travel without one or both of them. Although this is not a requirement, it will save time if questions arise while clearing customs.

Tour cost. The tour cost is based on a group of 15 passengers and current tariffs for air and land arrangements.

Please note that these travel arrangements are subject to possible price

increases due to additional charges imposed by a supplier or government. You may be charged additional sums by Witte to offset increased fees, fuel surcharges, taxes, fluctuations in foreign exchange markets, and/or smaller group size. Before passing on an increase, Witte will use its best efforts to minimize the amount. If it is necessary to increase the tour cost, participants will be advised at final billing and provided with a summary of the contributing factors. Your signature below indicates consent to any post-purchase price increases.

Reservations and payments. To make reservations on this tour, complete the Registration Form and return it as indicated. Reservations cannot be accepted over the telephone. Payments are due as follows:

Deposit of \$600 per person with Registration Form. Early registration is encouraged.

Payment of \$1,700 per person by July 15

Balance due on receipt of final invoice sent approximately 30 to 45 days prior to departure.

If you are registering for the tour after one of the above payment dates, increase your deposit amount accordingly so your account will be up to date. **Please note that checks returned due to insufficient funds are subject to a \$30 service fee.**

Credit card payments. Visa, MasterCard, Discover or American Express credit cards are accepted for the deposit and scheduled payments. The deposit charge is processed shortly after receipt of your registration form. Subsequent payments are charged per the payment schedule.

Cancellations and refunds. Witte must receive notice of cancellation in writing. Penalties are per person and will be based on the date of receipt, as follows:

More than 90 days before departure	\$400
Between 90 and 46 days before departure	\$600
Between 45 and 31 days before departure	\$1,500
30 or fewer days before departure	No refund

The service fee noted under “Special Flight Arrangements,” the nonrefundable portion of any special arrangements made on behalf of the canceling participant and the cost of travel protection will also be added to the above penalties. Cancellation insurance is available. Allow two to four weeks for processing of refunds. Note that payments made by check are refunded by check to the person or organization that made the payments, and payments charged to a credit card are credited back to the same credit card.

Membership. Witte reserves the right to accept or reject any person as a member of the tour and to expel from the tour any participant whose conduct or condition is incompatible with the interest of the group.

Land-only participants. If you wish to make your own flight arrangements, contact Witte for the land-only cost at least 90 days prior to departure. Participants who make their own flight arrangements are strongly encouraged to coordinate their flight schedules with the group’s flight schedule and to use the same airports. The group’s airport transfers on the arrival and return days will be timed to the group’s flight schedule. Land-only participants may need to arrange for their own airport transfers. Contact Witte for information and costs on options for private transfers. Witte cannot be responsible for any inconveniences to land-only participants resulting from changes in the group’s flight schedule. Participants who change their status to land-only less than 90 days prior to departure may be subject to penalties imposed by the airlines.

Domestic flight connections. Note on your registration form if you would like to fly to and from the international departure city. You will be contacted with schedule options and costs. **Witte must receive requests for connecting flights at least 45 days prior to departure.**

Special flight arrangements. Note on your registration form if you would like to extend your stay and/or depart from and/or return to another city. The number of passengers who can deviate from the group’s flight schedule is restricted. You will be contacted to let you know if the arrangements you requested are possible and to advise you of schedule options and costs. Upon confirmation of

your special arrangements, a nonrefundable service fee of \$75 per person will be added to your account along with any additional air or land costs that may apply. **In the event of cancellation, the service fee and any nonrefundable portion of special air or land arrangements made for you will be added to the penalties noted under “Cancellations and Refunds.” Witte must receive requests for special flight arrangements at least 45 days prior to departure.**

Special meal requests and food allergies. Note special meal requests and food allergies on your registration form. Witte cannot be responsible if special requests are not met but we will pass them on to the airlines, hotels and restaurants. If you have dietary restrictions or food allergies, be sure to carry your medications with you at all times. Also, discuss your special needs with your tour personnel and ask the wait staff about the foods you are served.

Mobility Concerns. Sightseeing on Witte tours almost always includes walking. Visits to historical places often mean climbing stairs and walking on uneven surfaces or cobblestones. Handicap accessibility is not always available. Witte tour personnel are not able to provide attendant services. Tour participants with special needs are strongly encouraged to travel with someone who can assist them. Consult your physician if you have any concerns about your ability to participate.

Time away from the tour. Advise Witte in writing at least 45 days before departure if you plan to spend some time away from the tour. Wherever possible, you will be credited for missed hotel nights.

Final tour documents—including itinerary, hotel list, passenger list, flight schedules with departure instructions, and luggage tags—are sent about 10 days prior to departure. Flight tickets are usually made available at the airport at check-in time.

Responsibility. As the tour operator, Witte Travel & Tours will be responsible for supplying the services and accommodations outlined in the brochure as constituting the tour, except to the extent that such services cannot be supplied, wholly or partially, owing to circumstances beyond its control. In such cases, Witte Travel & Tours will use its best efforts to supply alternative services and accommodations, and no refunds will be granted provided that the alternatives are comparable to the original services and accommodations included in the tour cost. Witte Travel & Tours, its agents, sponsors, organizers and employees shall not be responsible for any injury, loss, damage, accident, delay, irregularity or expense arising from strikes, weather, sickness, acts of war or terrorism, governmental restrictions or regulations or from any act or omission on the part of any individual or company furnishing transportation, accommodations or any other services to the tour participants; nor shall Witte Travel & Tours be responsible for any injuries, death, damages, loss or delay in any means of transportation or by reason of any event beyond its actual control.
